

# ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

**Susan Deily-Swearingen** is a history instructor at the Arts Academy of New Hampshire. She earned her degree from the University of New Hampshire, where her dissertation was directed by Professor J. William Harris (*Deep Souths*) and her committee included Professor Victoria Bynum (*The Free State of Jones*). Her first book, titled *Rebel Rebels: Race, Resistance, and Remembrance in the Free State of Winston*, is in final edits and is being published by the University Press of Kentucky. She is busy developing her second book based on a lecture she gave for the Organization of American Historians' podcast, *Intervals*, called "The Southern Cross and the MAGA Movements: The Reimagining and Repurposing of a Confederate Symbol in the U.S. and Abroad."

Susan was part of the first class of Emerging Voices Scholars with the American Council of Learned Societies. She served her fellowship year teaching at Cornell University and working with the university's Society for Rural Humanities. Susan has spent nearly two decades as a scholar and educator, and in 2018, she was awarded the University of New Hampshire History Department's Excellence in Teaching Prize. She has presented her research at multiple conferences, including the Conference of the Southern Historical Association (Atlanta), the Roosevelt Institute for American Studies (Middleburg, Netherlands), and two conferences hosted by Virginia Tech University in Blacksburg and Arlington, VA.
