Mark Grimsley has been a member of the Ohio State Department of History since 1992. From July 2008 through June 2010, he held the Harold Keith Johnson Chair of Military History, a visiting professorship at the U.S. Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania. His teaching and research interests include military history, 19th century American history, insurgencies, and the problem of moral judgment in war.

He has received three teaching awards: the Clio Award, 1994; the Ben M. Jones Award, 1997; and the Ohio State Alumni Award for Distinguished Teaching, 1999.
